Message from the CFA

As we are residents in a high fire risk area we need to be self-reliant to ensure our safety from bushfire. We all need to plan ahead and prepare. The CFA has information and advice to help everyone prepare for bushfire and grassfire. We all need to know the importance of leaving early and how a well thought out bushfire survival plan can help.



Property preparation is about carrying out work that reduces the impact of radiant heat, embers and flames near your buildings and assets.

The five simple things you can do to prepare for fire are:-

Prepare buildings - Clean gutters. Clear around buildings of waste and flammable materials. Set up sprinklers.

Manage vegetation - Reduce vegetation and weeds around the house and other buildings including sheds.

Create fuel breaks - Mowing and spraying around boundaries and fence lines to create wide areas without fuel for a fire.

Prepare for emergency management of livestock and pets - Plan for relocation of livestock on high risk days including preparation of containment areas.

Prepare a reliable fire-fighting water supply. Fire-fighting pumps should be petrol or diesel powered and easy to start and prime. Hoses need to be long enough to reach all sides of buildings.

Fire tankers are large, heavy vehicles that can weigh up to 15 tonne. A turning circle with a minimum 8 metre radius is needed to allow a fire tanker access to buildings and key assets. For tankers to fit through, gates and tracks need to be at least 3.5 metres wide, clear of encroachments for another 0.5 metres either side and clear of overhanging branches lower than 4 metres high. All bridges, culverts and creek crossings need to have at least a 15 tonne load-bearing capacity for a tanker to cross.

Landowners are strongly encouraged to have water supplies available for and accessible to emergency services.

Fire Danger Ratings tell you how dangerous a fire could be if one started. The higher the rating the more dangerous the conditions.

Please ensure you complete your burn offs before fire restrictions come into force. The important contacts everyone needs to know are –

Remembering & Farewells



Peter Arbuthnot

Dad and his twin sister were born in Mansfield on 13 July 1937 to Mark and Lottie Elizabeth Eva Arbuthnot. He was the youngest of ten brothers and sisters.

The family lived in the valley that is now under the Bonnie Doon Weir – near Kennedy's Point on the way to Maintongoon. It was about four miles to walk to school from the small farm where they ran a few cows and horses and grew veggies.

The family moved to the new town when the valley was flooded. Growing up, Dad slept on the veranda of the family home in

summer with his siblings – he also slept there in winter with hessian bags. He often spoke of hunting rabbits with his siblings, which his mother cooked. He soon became a boarder at Rupertswood College, Sunbury, during primary school. He recalled being put on a dray with his brothers and arriving at school. He said he wasn't told he was going and returned home on term break where possible.

Dad married Mum, Margaret, in 1960. He met her at the Merton Ball, describing her as 'plain looking' which meant that she was naturally beautiful. They moved to Woodfield after their marriage.

His first job was as a farm labourer. He earned 5 pounds a week and supplemented his wage rabbiting and foxing. He had a large pack of dogs that became town dogs and he always had three or four on them on his lap on his recliner. He sold the pelts and scalps to a fellow at Euroa, making his way over the Strathbogie Ranges weekly to offload them. Dad often said we three kids would have starved without rabbits. We loved rabbit stew and Dad often made jokes about 'Myxo', he was always a stirrer.

Over his working life, he worked as the farm manager on many of the districts well known holdings. Mum and Dad knew the value of education and spent their lives working multiple jobs, and we are eternally grateful for.

Dad played footy for Doon, he played in the premiership sides, he took on the role of trainer when he retired as a player, and he and Mum spent years working for the club and on the committee. Later, he was awarded life membership.

He was also a member of the Bonnie Doon CFA.

Peter has been a wonderful dad, grandad, great grandad, and a terrific friend who had your back. All of their grandkids and great grandkids were special to Dad. He loved taking them to school and being a part of their lives.

Our life has been so much better and wonderful for having him in it

Historic Bonnie Doon: A Flashback

Excerpt taken from 'Historical Aspects of Bonnie Doon' page 70

FOOTBALL In August, 1885 the first signs of a football club in Bonnie Doon became evident around the township. A correspondent of the time noted that the young men involved were training keenly and should make a 'grand show in time', although most of them had never seen a ball before, much less kicked one!

Shortly after, Doon played its first match against Mansfield. Owing to a misunderstanding among the Mansfield players, play did not commence until 4:00 p. m. The Doon team turned out in "proper football costume" and the following names appeared on the team sheet: Wallace (Capt.), Dolling, Brown, Mathison, Keirnan, Jeffrey, Woolf, Mackerell, Martin, Donaldson, Woodbridge, Almond, Maxwell and Arbuthnot. The game was fairly well-contested throughout, and in the most "friendly spirit", although the interpretation of the rules by the central umpire was "occasionally questioned in a charitable manner". The game finished in Mansfield's favour and a re-match was scheduled for 5th September at Doon. Again Mansfield ran out victors but unfortunately

there is no existing report on the match itself.

In 1906 of Bonnie Doon joined the Mansfield Football League

and defeated Mansfield in the Grand Final of that year.

In 1928 the team went through the entire season undefeated to capture another premiership.
